
The half-mile walking radius around each proposed stop was rated based on access to Day Care, Health Care, Education, Government Services, Community Amenities, Food, Banking, Shopping, Employment and other livability factors. The 63rd Avenue stop, for example, rated an A- for community amenities such as parks, but failed to provide most basic needs.

The student survey and light rail report card are the first steps in a larger project looking at **transportation equity** in Brooklyn Park. Breck School students, in conjunction with Cities United and the City of Brooklyn Park received a grant from What Kids Can Do to study intracommunity transportation.

Their goal is to create comprehensive recommendations on bus routes, light rail connectivity, and car-sharing to community officials.

Dependent vs. Independent Travelers

Youth who have access to vehicles drive themselves. The majority of youth, however, rely on family members to get around.

When looking at second-choice alternatives, two groups arose.

Dependent Travelers relied on friends for transportation or didn't travel.

Independent Travelers walked or rode bicycles, turning to public transportation only as a last resort.

When independent travelers were questioned further, two common themes arose.

Public transportation is inconvenient.

"You have to leave two or three hours early to get anywhere and then you'll still probably be late."

Public transportation is perceived to be unsafe.

"You don't want to f*ck with the 19 or the 5."
